Where are classes held?

Classes are held at the Croatian Catholic Community Clifton Hill at **69 Hodgkinson Street, Clifton Hill** in dedicated classrooms.

What is the first day of School like?

The first day is our Welcome Day and a short format day. It will be on Saturday 3 February 2024. Returning students will get a chance to meet the new students.

Teachers will explain the school year and provide guidance for any textbooks that can be purchased where required. Learning aims to use a variety of resources and will include a fun and diverse mix of language, culture and history.

Regular classes will commence the following week on Saturday 10 February 2024.

School Information

Student Collection Policy

The school has the following procedures in place for the safe drop-off and collection of students from school, both during and after normal school hours (9am to 12:30pm).

Please supervise your children to classrooms.

All students to be signed-in in the mornings and signed-out at collection.

If a student needs to leave early (eg. sports events), parent/guardian to collect from classroom and sign the student out.

All parents / guardians to collect students from classroom after school finishes for the day at 12:30pm.

Please be punctual when collecting students and notify the principal and teachers of delays or early pick-up



Illness or Absenses

Please ensure your child remains at home if unwell and notify the Principal or Teacher if they will be absent for any length of time.

Students Medical Information

It is important that any student medication information is included in the enrolment form so that the teachers and first aid officers are aware.

Emergency Contacts

Please ensure you let the school know if there are any changes to the emergency contact details on the enrolment form throughout the year.

Curriculum & Classes

Depending on student numbers, our school can have up to 3 class groups with interesting & fun lessons for each age group. Our curriculum focused on language and covers culture, history, geography and the students' own Croatian heritage.

Junior Class

Our students embark on an exciting journey of linguistic discovery and cultural exploration. With a focus on building a strong foundation in language skills, the curriculum emphasizes interactive and engaging activities to make learning enjoyable.

Through storytelling, games, and interactive exercises, students not only acquire essential vocabulary and grammar but also develop confidence in speaking and expressing themselves in the Croatian language.

Middle Class

The middle-class students, often seeking practical skills navigate through the intricacies of grammar and vocabulary, with many opportunities to engage with modern and traditional songs through the year.



Senior Class

Strong language skills have been honed through engaging discussions, debates, and presentations, fostering critical thinking and analytical abilities.

Additionally, the seniors have explored literary works, delving into the richness of language through literature, poetry, and classic texts.

Enrolment Information

When is enrolment open and fees due for 2024?

New student and re-enrolments for existing students begin in November each year. Student places are limited with enrolments due by mid-March each year unless closed prior.

New student enrolment and re-enrolment for existing students begins in November each year. Enrolments and fee payments close mid March in order to ensure VDET accreditation funding is obtained.

Contact the school to discuss late enrolments to ensure places are available and there will be impacts to funding and result in higher student fees.

Information for Students

Class Rules...YES! We have Class Rules!

- 1. Pohađaj nastavu redovito. / Attend classes regularly.
- 2. Dođi na vrijeme u školu. / Arrive on time to school.
- **3. Za vrijeme nastave potrudi se komunicirati na hrvatskom jeziku.** / During the class make an effort to communicate in Croatian language.
- **4. Aktivno sudjeluj u nastavi i timski surađuj s drugim učenicima**. / Participate actively in class activities and in team work activities with other students.
- 5. Za vrijeme nastave suzdrži se od brbljanja, hodanja po razredu, zadirkivanja drugih učenika, sjedenja na stolu, držanja nogu na stolu I ljuljanje na stolici. / During the class refrain from chatting, walking around the classroom, teasing other students, sitting on the table, putting legs on a table and rocking chair.
- 6. Redovito uradi domaću zadaću. / Complete your homework regularly.
- 7. U školi, strogo se zabranjuje: / At school it is strictly forbidden to:
- Izazivanje buke I nereda, svađa I medusobno vrijeđanje učenika (npr. psovke) / Make noise, disorderly behaviour, quarrel and use of inappropriate language (eg. swearing),
- izazivanje tuče, sudjelovanja u tuči i svaka vrsta nasilnog ponašanja. / provoking a fight, participating in a fight and any kind of violent behaviour.
- **8. Suzdrži se od konzumacije hrane za vrijeme nastave.** / Refrain from consuming food during the class.
- **9. Suzdrži se od upotrebe mobitela i drugih elektronskih uređaja za vrijeme nastave**. / Refrain from using mobile phone and any other electronic devises during the class.
- 10. Suglasan/a sam s komuniciranjem putem e- između učitelja, roditelja i učenika. / I give my consent for e-mail communication between teacher, parent and student.

Fulfilling our Duty of Care

- We have a zero tolerance towards child abuse. Any allegation and safety concern will be treated seriously and in line with our policies and procedures.
- Takes all reasonable steps to ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of children at all times, whilst also promoting their learning and development
- Actively managing the risks of abuse or harm to each child. This includes fulfilling our legal and moral obligations and upholding our duty of care to protect children and prevent any reasonable, foreseeable risk of injury or harm. This also includes contacting authorities when we have concerns about a child's safety.
- The Committee of Management is committed to implementing the minimum Child Safe Standards and creating a child safe organisation. We aim to continuously improve the way Croatian School of Language and Culture Melbourne prevents child abuse through maintaining specific policies and implementing training that supports our staff, committee and volunteers to achieve these commitments.
- Ensuring that the Child Safety Standards are mandatory professional development requirements for all staff and volunteers.

Member of Community Languages Victoria



The school is a member of Community Languages Victoria (CLV) who provide support to our school such as child safety policies, training, assistance with DET funding and professional development.

What is the School's Child Safety Policy?

The School's Child Safety Policy is developed by Community Languages Australia and can be found on our website or by clicking the link below.

A Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy supports schools to create and maintain a childsafe organisation where children and young people are safe and feel safe. The policy provides a framework for how schools approach child safety.

All school community members are responsible for caring for children and young people, positively promoting their well-being and protecting them from any harm or abuse.

The Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy tells the community about the strategies and arrangements to keep children safe.

Child Safety Policy

What is the School's Child Safety Standards Code of Conduct?

The School's Child Safe Standards Code of Conduct is developed by Community Languages Australia and can be found on our website. This Code of Conduct outlines appropriate standards of behaviour by adults towards children.

The Code of Conduct aims to protect children and reduce opportunities for abuse or harm. It also helps staff and volunteers by guiding how to best support children and avoid or better manage difficult situations. This Code of Conduct applies to all people involved in Croatian School of Language and Culture Melbourne's activities, including principals, teachers, coaches, officials, volunteers and parents. Croatian School of Language and Culture Melbourne has zero tolerance for child abuse.
